




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Privacy

The interest that individuals have in sustaining 'personal space' free from interference by other people and organisations





Very different from Security, and from Inaccessibility / 'Confidentiality' / Secrecy / Non-Disclosure

Types of Harm from Privacy Invasions

• Physical

Discovery of identity or location leads to *assault* and worse

• Psychological

Closed doors, drawn curtains, 'jumping for joy'; loss of control over one's life, *image*, and *respect*, undermining social cohesion

• Economic

<u>Stifling</u> of non-conformist, risk-taking, *inventive and innovative behaviour*, undermining cultural, scientific and economic change

• Political


Embarrassments, stigmas; self-repression (the '*chilling effect'*); political *repression*; a reduced pool of political contributors

• Philosophical

Autonomy, self-determination, human dignity, personal integrity




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Privacy Protection

- Privacy is one interest among many
- Privacy may conflict with other interests:
 - of the person themselves
 - of another person
 - of a group or community
 - of an organisation
 - of society as a whole
- Privacy Protection is a process of finding appropriate balances between privacy and multiple competing interests


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


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The Digital Persona

Surveillance

• The systematic investigation or monitoring of the actions or communications of one person ('personal surveillance') or many people ('mass surveillance')

Dataveillance

- The consolidation of personal data from multiple sources, and the use of information technologies to exploit that data
- Less expensive. Even in 1986, nearly as good More efficient watching of more people More efficient behaviour-influence and control



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Location

An entity's proximity to known reference points, within a defined space, at a defined point in time

- Physical Space ('Geo-Location')
- Network Space
- Intellectual Space

• Tracking

The entitity's sequence of locations over a period of time

• **Temporality** Retrospective / Contemporaneous / Real-Time / Prospective

Risks

Correct Inferences re Actions, Attitudes, Intentions, Associates Incorrect Inferences about <ditto> Interception

Digit<u>al</u>isation

The adaptation of organisational processes to take full advantage of Digitisation

- Interactions are with Digital Personae, not people Each human, and their identities, can be largely ignored
- **Organisations reduce their costs and their risks** No wet-chem emotions, ambiguity, tolerance, compassion, ...
- Web 2.0 technologies (2005-)
- The Privacy of Personal Experience has been shredded Access to live events, text, data, image and video switched from mostly-anonymous analogue to mostly-identified digital forms

"[The game is about] inducing consumers to give [marketers] the information they want.



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


Kinds of Privacy Safeguards

- Organisational
 - Policies, Procedures, Practices
 - Training
 - Incident and Complaints Systems
 - **Technical** 'Privacy-Enhancing Technologies' (PETs)



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Privacy Act (Cth) and APPs

- The Australian Privacy Principles (APPs) https://www.oaic.gov.au/privacy/australian-privacyprinciples/australian-privacy-principles-quick-reference [And that's the shortened version!]
- The law is full of designed-in loopholes
- The law lacks specific guidance • e.g. OAIC 'Guide to securing personal information' provides limited assistance, and sets no baseline
- The law is largely unenforced

s.80A - Temporary public interest determinations

- As fo s.72 plus the issues require an urgent decision
- s.80G Emergencies (see also ss.80P, 80Q)
- for a purpose that directly relates to the Commonwealth's response to an emergency or disaster in respect of which an emergency declaration is in force, incl. identifying individuals injured, missing, dead or involved
- assisting such individuals
 - assisting law enforcement
 - · informing 'responsible persons' for such individuals

s.95 - Medical Research [enormous power granted to the NH&MRC]

- s.95A Health Information [enormous power granted to the NH&MRC] research
- the compilation or analysis of statistics, relevant to public health or public safety
- s.95AA Genetic Information Jenormous power granted to the NH&MRC1 lessening or preventing a serious threat to the life, health or safety of an individual who is a genetic relative of the individual to whom the genetic information relates
- s 100 Regulations, incl. necessary or convenient for carrying out or giving effect to this Act



APP2.2 - anonymity and pseudonymity

- if the APP entity is required or authorised to deal with individuals who have identified themselves if it is impracticable
- APP3 collection of solicited personal information consent and reasonably necessary for, or directly related to, one or more of the agency's
- functions or activities consent and reasonably necessary for one or more of the organisation's functions or activities
- required or authorised by law
- a permitted general situation exists
- a permitted health situation exists
- an enforcement body . a non-profit organisation.
- APP6 use or disclosure of personal information [Usual long list similar to APP3]
- APP7 Direct Marketing
- Despite the nominal prohibition, [Authorisation of non-consensual, opt-out use of personal data
- for direct marketing]
- Despite the nominal prohibition, [Authorisation of non-consensual use of personal data by contracted service providers for a Commonwealth contract]
- ... such steps (if any) as are reasonable in the circumstances

- agencies retain the scope to use all FOI and other exemptions organisations have a long list of loopholes available
- ... give access to the information in the manner requested by the individual, if it is reasonable and practicable to do so
- organisation may charge a fee
- APP13 correction of personal information

s.16 - personal data held for Personal, family or household affairs

- missing persons: to assist any APP entity, body or person to locate a person who has been reported as missing
- protection of (any entity's?) legal interests: the establishment, exercise or defence of a legal or equitable claim
